- 1. Have you visited Yosemite, the area described? Before reading the book, what did you know of Muir?
- 2. If you knew nothing of Muir, what would you think of his philosophy after reading this book? What is his conception of G-d? How does he find G-d in Yosemite?
- 3. Is there a sense of escapism in Muir's reluctance to leave the mountains? Is he running from something?
- 4. How did Muir view social relationships? Would you go trekking with this guy? Why or why not? What questions would you ask him?
- 5. How did you feel about Muir's descriptions of indigenous people? (They had been recently expelled from Yosemite).
- 6. Why did Muir develop an aversion to the shepherd (and the sheep)? How would you reconcile livestock grazing with conserving the environment?
- 7. In his rambles and long hikes through forests, why didn't Muir ever get lost? How was he measuring tree height and feet above sea level?
- 8. Can you envision a vast landscape without plastic waste and air pollution? How much would you be willing to pay in taxes to conserve it?
  - 9. Muir read books by starlight. Where would you have to go now to do this?
- 10. Did you zone out during Muir's descriptions of flora? Which ones did you google? Is there an advantage in the ability to recognize wild plants? Would recognizing edible larvae be a useful skill? Muir thought he could survive all winter on a bag of flour. Hyperbole? (Matt Damon survived on potatoes on Mars.)
- 11. Muir's observations of glaciation in Yosemite were not initially accepted by the scientific community. Why do you think his views were discounted?
